MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF JOHNSTOWN AND THE CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, INC. (CSEA)

WHEREAS, the City of Johnstown (hereinafter "City") and CSEA, Local 1000 AFSCME, AFL-CIO, The City of Johnstown Public Works Unit 6902-00, Fulton County Local 818 ("CSEA" or "Association") (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties") are parties to a Collective Bargaining Agreement covering the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2025 ("Agreement"); and,

WHEREAS, the city is required to provide CDL certified training to employees holding a CDL license; and,

WHEREAS, the parties wish to recognize this duty as CSEA exclusive bargaining unit work and have met to negotiate extra compensation for those employees providing CDL training; and,

THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The parties agree to meet and decide which employee(s) shall be providing CDL required training.
- 2. The parties agree that only CDL Certified trainers shall be selected to provide the required training.
- 3. Employees providing CDL Certified training shall be compensated \$5.00 plus their regular hourly wages for the time they are training other employees or performing any required duties related to the training of CDL licensed employees.
- 4. This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to approval by the City Board and CSEA membership ratification procedure at which time it shall become effective.

WHEREAS, the income eligibility level for computing real property tax exemption available to persons 65 years of age or older, with owner-occupied residential property within the City of Johnstown, will change in accordance with the following schedule of exemptions:

New breeching to connect to existing chimney

All black or copper piping from new boiler to existing
