In the month of **June**, the Fire department conducted in-service training on Drafting and Pump operations, the Code division continued Training on Commercial Plan review and the EMS division completed their EMT recertification requirement programs.

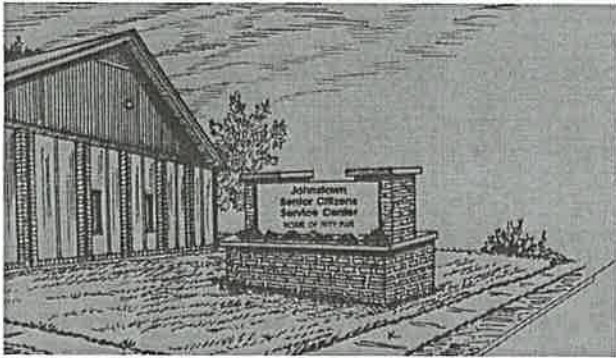
- There were 77 Citations issued.

Card making on the 21st had so much interest that in September we may have two classes. The Art Class on Thursday's from 9:30 – 11:30am is no longer charging a fee and has evolved into a very nice social group open to everyone. The center is still supplying the paint, brushes, and canvases or you can bring your own, so come join in the fun. The Tech Ed class will be held on August 4th and 11th at 10:30am with Margaret Clark, Computer Tutor. Margaret is showing people how to use apps including Google maps and Pinterest, and she is available to answer your specific questions.

Thank you to Ray Baker for donating new carpet in the pool room and Carol Miller for painting the room. The pool room really looks professional now. Men and women are welcome to play and we will be starting open pool on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 10am – 12pm beginning in August, in addition to the regular schedule in the Eavesdropper.

I want to thank our DPW department for all their hard work keeping the center looking nice this summer. The flowers on Main Street are looking beautiful, as well as the parks throughout the city. Our city looks very welcoming and it's due to all their hard work.

I am very proud to have been awarded "Business Partner of the Year" from The Fulton, Montgomery, and Schoharie Counties Workforce Development Board. We have been working together for several years and during the summer we have youth working at the center learning skills that will help them in the future.
