Chapter 81  
RECREATION COMMITTEE

Chapter 81

81-1 Recreation Committee.

- A. There shall be a Recreation Committee, the head of which shall be the Director of Tourism and Special Events, who shall be appointed for a four (4) year term by the Mayor with approval of the Common Council. The Recreation Committee shall be constituted and empowered as a Recreation Committee pursuant to General Municipal Law.

81-2 Organization

- A. The Director shall serve under the direction and supervision of the Mayor and shall be entitled to a stipend as approved by the Common Council at their yearly organizational meeting.
- B. The Committee shall consist of five (5) members to be appointed initially for terms of:
  - i. two members appointed for one year
  - ii. three members appointed for two years, and
  - iii. two members appointed for three years, then as the terms of members of the Committee expire members shall be appointed to a standard three-year term.
- C. Appointees shall have demonstrated continuing interest in community recreation activities and programs.
- D. Members of such Committee shall serve without pay.
- E. The members of a Recreation Committee established pursuant to this article shall elect from their own number a chairman and secretary and other necessary officers to serve for one year, and may employ such persons as may be needed, as authorized by this act and pursuant to law. Such a Recreation Committee shall have power to adopt rules of procedure for the conduct of all business within its jurisdiction.

81-3 Duties of the Recreation Committee.

- A. Conduct and supervise recreational activities in all public parks and recreational areas and facilities organized by the Committee.
- B. Responsible for planning and putting into operation measures for promoting and conducting recreational activities for children and adults.
- C. Promote the history of the City of Johnstown.

81-4 Donations.

- A. The Recreation Committee may accept any grant, gift or bequest of money or other personal property or any donation to be applied principal or income for either temporary or permanent use for recreation purposes, but if the use thereof for such purpose will subject the municipality to expense for improvement, maintenance or renewal, the use of any grant or devise of real estate shall be approved by the board or body establishing such Recreation Committee.
- B. Money received for such purpose, unless otherwise provided by the terms of the gift or bequest, shall be deposited with the treasurer of the City to the account of the Recreation Committee, and the same may be withdrawn and paid out in the same manner as money appropriated for recreation purposes.
